

Terms and conditions for the SolidWorks World 2010 Official Internet Correspondent Contest

Official Rules

1. No payment or purchase is required to participate. ONLY ONE ENTRY IS PERMITTED PER PERSON. The Contest will begin at 9:01 a.m. EDT (GMT+5) on November 2, 2009, and all qualifying entries must be received by 5:59 p.m. EDT (GMT+5) on November 13, 2010 (the "Contest Period").
2. The prize: One (1) Grand Prize Winner will receive a full conference pass to SolidWorks World 2010, January 31 - February 3, 2010 in Anaheim , California (\$895 value). Flight and accommodation booking are the responsibility of the contest winner. The prize is non-transferrable and cannot be substituted or redeemed for cash except at the sponsor's sole discretion. Sponsor reserves the right to substitute a prize of equal or greater value if a prize cannot be awarded as described for any reason.
3. The winner of the contest will be required to meet with the Dassault Systèmes SolidWorks Corporation (DS SolidWorks) Social Media Manager or his representative on Saturday, January 30, 2009 or Sunday, January 31, 2009 to discuss coverage of the event. The winner will be provided with a video camera for use during the event, which must be returned to an authorized DS SolidWorks employee prior to his or her departure. The contest winner will be required to record the event via videos and/or photos of the event and post them to YouTube and Flickr as the event is taking place, or provide files to an authorized DS SolidWorks representative for posting. The contest winner will also be given guest blogger access to the SolidWorks blog, and will be expected to post regular blog entries, or compose entries and provide them to an authorized DS SolidWorks representative for posting. The contest winner will also be expected to update Twitter regularly during the event using the #SWW10 hash tag.
4. The winner will be selected on or shortly after November 16, 2010, from all eligible registrants. An eligible registrant is someone twenty-one (21) years old or older who posts a comment to the SolidWorks blog (<http://blogs.solidworks.com/solidworksblog/>) stating why he or she should be chosen as the SolidWorks World Official Internet Correspondent. The winner will be chosen based on the creativity and composition of his or her response, and will not be picked at random. The winner will be notified by email.
5. The probability of winning depends on the number of eligible survey responses received. DS SolidWorks cannot predict the probability of winning as the company has no prior knowledge of the number of the entrants.
